Colantoni, best known for his TV roles on "Just Shoot Me" and "Veronica Mars," also has starred in "Galaxy Quest," "The Wrong Guy" and "Artificial Intelligence: A.I."

Chabert, who starred on the TV series "Party of Five," most recently appeared in Paramount Pictures' "Mean Girls."
