Opposites attract

Unlikely duo pairs up in 'Sherman's Way'

NEWPORT — "Sherman's Way" is a lighthearted road movie about two vastly opposite guys who never travel very far, at least in terms of miles.

But director Craig Saavedra and lead actor Michael Shulman are glad their road headed to Newport, where they screened their film at the Opera House on Wednesday night.

Saavedra spent chunks of his childhood summers visiting Newport. And New Yorker Shulman spends the Christmas season here, staying with his girlfriend at the La Farge Perry House.

"Anyone who actually lives here is very lucky," the 26-year-old actor said. "It's just so beautiful."

"Sherman's Way" tells the tale of an anal-retentive Yale student of privilege named Sherman who unexpectedly meets up with a former Olympic athlete and

current ne'er-do-well named Palmer (James LeGros), who encounter a few bumps and oddballs along the way.

"They're two guys who really don't like each other," Saavedra said. "But things kind of work out."

The movie was well received Wednesday night from a crowd of about 60. The Newport International Film Festival is the third festival for "Sherman's Way."

Shulman and Saavedra were visiting the Newport festival for the first time. "But one of the things that really appealed to me about showing it at this festival is the chance to visit Newport again," Shulman said.

The director and actor (who coproduced the film) met about 10 years ago, when Saavedra directed Shulman in an

The festival solicits local residents to house filmmakers and Saavedra and Shulman are staying with James and Sue Klau of Newport.

"It's the first film festival I've been to where they have you stay with a local family," Shulman said. "That's a nice touch."

Shulman planned to return to New York today but will be back when "Sherman's Way" screens again Saturday at 2:45 p.m. at Opera House 3.

"It's fun to get a sense of the audience's reaction," he said. "That makes it exciting. It's great just to be part of this event."
